- 1. Welcome Mike Nightingale as Chief Deputy Superintendent effective July 1, 2018.
- 2. Welcome Tom Hamer as Associate Superintendent effective August 20, 2018. 3. Welcome Rod Swartzenberger as Facility Services Supervisor effective October 1, 2018.
- **4. Minister of Education David Eggen** recognized Palliser School Division for success in the dual credit work and CTS courses offered in its' high school programs.
- **5. David Shaw, Transportation Supervisor**, recently received a perfect rating of 0.00 on it's carrier profile issued by Alberta Transportation. We sincerely thank him and his team for safely transporting our students in the Palliser division.

# Coaldale Community Meeting June 21, 2018 (Palliser, Town of Coaldale & FWBA Architects Reps)

Discussion of modernization vs. new school construction. Coaldale's pop. has increased 20% last 5 yrs. Schools will outgrow their capacity. Possible future grade configuration: (K-3) (4-6) (7-12)

Coaldale Town has land to offer, and wants to pursue new Recreational Centre to serve the community & school. KAHS present site is limited for future development.

Value Management Plan has been submitted to the govt. for consideration of proposals. Oct. 16, 2018 a meeting is planned with Town of Coaldale and Palliser School Board to discuss proposals.

# **Debbie Laturnus's Report**

Today we had our organizational meeting and Robert Strauss was re-elected as board chair, I was also re-elected as vice chair and Lorelei Bexte was elected as alternate vice chair. We also assigned trustees to committees and alternate schools.

October 16<sup>th</sup>, we will be meeting with the Town of Coaldale to discuss dual credits with the fire hall, update on capital plan and partnership with the town.

Enrolment right at the moment is up 20 students from the projected numbers. September 30 will be the day for the final count.

Palliser educational centre is in need of some mechanical upgrades. There has not been any major upgrades since purchasing the building. There are 6 rooftop units and as of right now,

only 3 are partially working. There are concerns in our lease agreements with the renters in the building regarding the heating and cooling. There are serious plumbing issues. Dexter and Dave will be speaking with a mechanical engineer to get a better understanding as to what all needs to get done. The money to pay for these upgrades comes from the renters; also the division has a 3.6% cap on board and system admin which is to be used for the education centre. No money will be coming out of funding for classrooms.

Palliser is going to be selling 4 acres of frontage property.

We have a new facility services manager, Rod Schwartzenberger, who will be starting on Oct 1.

Grand opening for Noble Central is November 15 at 2pm.
