




## \*\*NEW: Book your times with your EDSBY account!\*\*

#### Please contact the Office if you need help getting this account set up.






You can also remove your booking or change it to another available time.

#### **GRADE 5 POD NEWS**

Parents, please check with your child in regards to classroom supplies. Many students are without the basics such as pencils and erasers. Spring is just around the corner, so remember to dress for the weather.

**Language Arts:** We have been working diligently on writing our Stuck Stories! In March, we will begin our examination of nonfiction text features, and texts like Who Would Win and Friend or Foe. Students will continue to read their own novels as well!



**Math:** We have just finished our division unit and are moving onto Patterns in Mathematics where we will be looking at using algebraic expressions and solving unknown variables to determine and represent patterns.

**Science:** We will be starting our weather unit! Students learn about weather phenomena and the methods used for weather study. They learn to measure temperatures, wind speed and direction, the amounts of rain and snow, and the amount of cloud cover. In studying causes and patterns of air movements, students learn about the effects of uneven heating and cooling and discover the same patterns of air movement in indoor environments as are found outdoors. They also learn about human actions that can affect weather and climate and study the design and testing of clothing used as protection against the weather.

**Social Studies:** We are currently studying the Great Lakes - St. Lawrence Lowlands region, understanding how the physical features of this region shape the people living in the smallest, yet most-populated region of Canada.

#### **GRADE 6 POD NEWS**

**Language Arts:** This month we will be working on our narrative story writing skills. We will work to develop our understanding of story writing further, and then students will have the opportunity to put their learning into practice. Students will write, edit, and revise their work to strengthen these narrative writing skills. This will also be preparation for our Part A: PAT in mid-May.



**Math:** March will see us beginning Unit #4: Patterns and Expressions. Students will also be doing daily work with operations of whole numbers. I encourage all students to practice their basic multiplication, division, addition and subtraction facts at home on a daily basis to improve their speed and mastery of those skills. We will be moving through this next unit at a steady pace so it is vital that students are checking Google Classroom if they are absent, or seeing their teacher for help at recess or after school if they need extra instruction to understand a concept.

**Science:** In March we will be starting our fourth Unit, Flight. This unit shares many common ideas and principles with Air & Aerodynamics (Unit #3 wrapped up in February). We will continue looking at the properties of air, as well as the four forces of flight, and specific names of parts of airplanes and what their functions are, and a comparison between human made flying devices to flying animals and insects. There will be many demonstrations, experiments and hands-on projects in this unit, making it one of the favorite Science units for most Grade 6 students.

**Social:** We just wrapped up our unit on "How Provincial Government Works." Mr. Conrad is welcoming a student teacher from the University of Lethbridge into the classroom. In collaboration with Mr. Conrad, Ms. Johannesson will be teaching the next unit on Ancient Greece. We are very excited to see what Ms. Johannesson can bring to grade 6's in social studies.



#### **GRADE 7 POD NEWS**

**Language Arts:** In March, students will be finishing up our exploration of the novel *The Giver* with a "mock" trial of one of the characters. From there we will be completing a crossover project with Science where they will be creating their own "Planet Earth" style video with voice overlay! Once that is completed we will be moving into our poetry unit.

**Math:** In March, the Grade 7's will be working on our unit on Patterns and Relations, and then moving into our fifth unit on Variables and Equations. We will use the skills we learned in evaluating expressions to help us as we begin to explore modelling and solving linear equations. Welcome to Ms. Gallimore, who will be taking over from Mrs. Holland for the remainder of the school year.

**Science:** This month we will work to finish up our third unit of study: Planet Earth. The unit test will be towards the end of the month. We're really excited to end the month, likely after the unit test, with a cross over project with LA where students are going to be creating their own "Planet Earth" style video with voice overlay!

**Social:** We will be finishing up with Chapter 7 which will wrap up the first half of our curriculum in which we learned about how Canada was formed as a country. After that we will begin Chapter 8 which will lead us into Canada after Confederation with a focus on the Métis community.



#### **GRADE 8 POD NEWS**

**Math:** March has us tackling Chapter 5: Pythagorean Theorem. This is quite a hands-on chapter and one that most students genuinely enjoy. We begin by revisiting the square of a number and identifying perfect squares. Then, students are introduced to the inverse operation: square roots. We also explore the approximate square root of numbers that are not perfect squares. Next, we investigate the Pythagorean Theorem. Students will both develop and apply this to solve problems involving right triangles. Following the completion of Chapter 5 will be Chapter 6: Measuring Prisms & Cylinders.

**Language Arts:** We have just wrapped up our film study of <u>Spider-man: Into the Spider-verse</u>, a movie about perseverance and finding the hero within. We studied cinematography, the effects of angles and lighting, and picked out the countless examples of literary devices present throughout the movie. Next up, we will be looking at the structure and techniques of argumentative essays as we approach them from unique perspectives.

**Science:** Welcome back! Students are going to finish their Mix & Flow of matter unit then we are going to have a lot of fun exploring our mechanical systems unit in March. Students will gain an understanding of simple machines and the principle behind hydraulic systems. There are quite a few hands-on projects coming up in this unit so it should be a nice way to wrap up the colder months!

**Social:** We are concluding our study of the Aztec unit this month and the students will get to practice looking at multiple perspectives and how both people in an argument can feel they are right. The curriculum will study what took place when the Spanish and the Aztecs met for the first time.
