



Assurance Framework Measures - Challenges

- There are still areas for improvement relative to historical results and the provincial average. These areas include Citizenship and Parental Involvement categories.
- Predominantly, the data showed that students did not feel as strongly in the positive sense towards some of these measures as did staff and parents. This does match the overall provincial trend, but work remains to be done to engage our student community.
- We will continue to work at meaningfully engaging our parent community with the goal of improving our parental involvement measures.
- We will continue to work with our parents and families to engage them in their child's learning and to ensure that they are aware of the support offered at RIBMS.

Evaluation

- While we did have a statistically marginal decline in this measure overall, we will continue to provide quality learning opportunities for students and staff (-0.6%)
- We encourage teachers to be innovative in their practice and provide opportunities for professional development and access to resources
- We have found strategies to provide time for exploratory options, despite having to reconfigure our timetable from the previous year.

Evaluation

- We are pleased to see an overall improvement in this measure from the previous year (+4%)
- We continue to work with our staff through their growth plans, checking in, offering feedback, assistance, and resources.
- We encourage our staff to provide innovative learning experiences to our students in their core and exploratory classes. We are able to provide support, resources, and time to the teachers so that they can plan these quality learning experiences.

- We are very pleased to see a substantial increase in this measure from last school year (+5.8%)

Evaluation

- We are very pleased to see an improvement in our parent perception figure. This is the highest that this measure has been in the last several years and in our interpretation, represents a reversal of some of the frustrations around the COVID-19 pandemic and school and jurisdictional decisions pertaining to that (+5.5%)
- We will continue to work with our parent council on a bi-monthly basis
- We will continue to communicate to families via our monthly newsletter, website, and social media accounts
- We will continue to invite families to provide feedback via surveys sent home through email
- We will encourage the school community to get involved in RIBMS events and in turn, have our students out in the community whenever possible.

Evaluation

- Overall there was minor decline in this measure, mostly relating to student and teacher perception measures, with steady increases in parent perceptions figures (-0.6%).
- There is work to be done in this measure, particularly in terms of student and teacher perceptions. With staff in particular, conversations should be had as to how we as a school foster the growth of students as engaged, active, and positive citizens.
- We will continue to provide leadership opportunities to students and to develop leadership skills.
- Students are taking the lead on more initiatives, through our leadership classes as well as our SLC club.
